# AFRICAN-AMERICAN HERITAGE & EXPERIENCES

African Americans played a vital role in creating what would become Newport News, Virginia. The black history of Newport News goes back to the early 1500s, creating a timeless legacy that can be felt in the city and throughout the region. Here you can enjoy experiences that honor the rich heritage of African Americans and celebrate the culture of today through arts, history, cuisine, and more!

## ARTS

Experience unique events and exhibits at the Downing-Gross Cultural Arts Center, an incredible facility at 2410 Wickham Avenue in the historic Southeast Community of Newport News. Its Anderson Johnson Gallery provides a vignette into the life of a legendary folk artist whose work had an impact on the residents of Newport News and beyond. The Center also includes changing exhibits with local and national visual artists and incredible live performances in the Ella Fitzgerald Theater, named for the “first lady of song” who hailed from Newport News.

Engage with artists and see cutting-edge work at the Contemporary Arts Network (CAN) at 9601 Warwick Boulevard. Guests will enjoy events, changing exhibits, and discussions with breakthrough painters, sculptors, and other creators.

## HISTORY

Walk the historic sands of Pinkett’s Beach, located at 600 Jefferson Avenue. William Ward Pinkett – a prominent tailor, business owner, and bandleader in Newport News during the early 1900s – owned and lived on the property and he offered up his land for public beach use by fellow African Americans living in the Southeast Community. He also built a pavilion and a building that doubled as a bath house and dance hall. In the decades between World War II and the end of segregation, Pinkett’s Beach was the only beach for African Americans in the city and became the center of summer life for many people.

CONTEMPORARY ARTS NETWORK (CAN)

Honor the legacy of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. at the MLK Plaza. Dr. King visited Newport News in 1958 and 1962 and spoke at the historic First Baptist Church of Newport News. You can find the plaza and sculpture at the corner of Jefferson Avenue and 25th Street.

## CUISINE

Enjoy the local flavor of Newport News by dining at a locally owned restaurant. We boast many eateries that are off the beaten path and feature unique dishes that embrace the African-American culture. From West African dishes at Lormnava Afrik Cuisine to soul food at spots throughout Newport News, enjoy delectable meals you’ll rave about for years!





The city has been focusing on the revitalization of its downtown area, with the goal of having more people visit and move there. It has branded downtown as “The Yard District” in a nod to Newport News Shipyard.

Various developments are in the works, along with new restaurants and other ventures spurring renewed interest in the area. Coastal Fermentory and Ironclad Distillery, both on 23rd Street, often collaborate to hold community block parties that include live music, food trucks, yard games, and other activities for the entire family. These events have been drawing crowds – resulting in increased foot traffic and a new “energy” downtown. The James River Strand, scheduled to open soon, will add to The Yard District’s revitalization by making the waterfront a destination for events, like small-scale performances and art shows.






## IN NEWPORT NEWS

If you're yearning for a liquid adventure, then head to Newport News and check out its craft beverage scene. Just about every establishment has a story to tell!

The city's first bourbon micro-distillery, *Ironclad Distillery*,

is located near the site of the famous Civil War naval battle between the USS *Monitor* and the CSS *Virginia*. Their labels feature blueprints of the two vessels, which help tell the story of the city's unique maritime heritage.

*Tradition Brewing Company*, the city's first craft brewery, was named in honor of the fond memories and rich history of Newport News, but it is also a nod toward "brewing" new memories and traditions in the future.

*Coastal Fermentory*, located in downtown Newport News, was started by three engineers who enjoyed homebrewing. Their passion led to countless hours of researching and experimenting until it finally evolved into the brewery it is today.

*At 1700 Brewing*, every pour is a salute to our heroes. This nano-brewery is 100 percent veteran owned-and-operated. Because they brew small batches, there are always a variety of styles in the mix, from traditional to experimental.

As more independent crafters continue to open, we expect our options for beer, wine and shine to grow. Cheers to a flourishing craft beverage scene in Newport News!




