AMERICAN INDIAN RESIDENTIAL BOARDING SCHOOLS

Warwick County Historical Society, 1884 Warwick Courthouse March 20; 12 Noon

In the early 1880s, young Native Americans from the Dakotas Territory were sent to Hampton Institute to be assimilated. This involved leaving their families and forsaking their heritage by giving up their native tongue, wearing Western clothing; adopting the white man's customs; learning English, how to read and write, and learning a trade. Some, unable to conform with the new lifestyle, went back to the blanket. Others accepted and incorporated the changes, choosing to live within two

cultures. Speaker Joanne Faulkner, State Chair of the DAR Indian Schools Committee, will share the fascinating story of her great grandmother Frances White Cow who left the Western Plains to come study and live in Virginia. Click here for details.

CONSERVING AMPHIBIANS ON THE VIRGINIA PENINSULA

Virginia Living Museum March 21; 6:30 to 7:30 p.m.

Dr. Matthias Leu, Associate Professor of Biology at William & Mary, is the guest speaker in tonight's "Naturally Speaking" Speaker Series. Global amphibian populations are declining rapidly. To address this, researchers study amphibian ecology on the Virginia Peninsula. One study focuses on two toad species' movements during their non-breeding period to understand their habitat needs. Another investigates factors influencing the number of salamanders in creeks by examining water quality, stream conditions, and surrounding land cover. This research aims to provide crucial insights to slow down amphibian losses. Dr. Matthias Leu has been a faculty member in the Biology Department at William & Mary since 2009.
