- 4. *Open access to the fountain* With no restricted access to the fountain, visitors will be able to immerse themselves in the show!
- 5. *Three Saturdays of fun* As an added treat, special events will be held on three consecutive Saturdays in December. Called *North Pole Nights*, the events will be held from 5 to 8 p.m. on Dec. 1, 8 & 15. Enjoy carolers, a winter carnival, children's crafts, Santa's Workshop, decorated storefront windows, plus more!
- 6. *The first North Pole Night* The theme for the first special event on Dec. 1 will be *Journey to the North Pole* and it will serve as the official opening of the *BayPort Credit Union 25 Nights of Northern Lights*. Right before the very 1<sup>st</sup> of the 125 shows kicks off at 6 p.m., a ceremony with City Officials will be held at 5:50 p.m.
- 7. *Dec.* 1<sup>st</sup> *Performances* Performers include the Academy of Dance at 5 p.m.; the City Arts Dance Company at 7 p.m.; holiday carolers at 5 p.m. and 7:10 p.m.; Santabones at 6:10 p.m.; and CNU A Capella groups from 5 to 8 p.m.
- 8. *The second North Pole Night* The theme for the second special event on Dec. 8 will be *Holiday Candy*. Special candy-themed decorations will transform City Center into a magical Candyland!
- 9. *Dec.* 8<sup>th</sup> *Performances* Performers include Soundscapes at 5 p.m.; the Academy of Dance at 5 p.m.; holiday carolers at 5 p.m. and 7:10 p.m.; Santabones at 6:10 p.m.; and the CNU A Capella group Extreme Measures at 6:10 p.m.
- 10. *The third North Pole Night* The theme for the third special event on Dec. 15 will be *Snow Pets*. Pets, on a leash or in a pet carrier or stroller, are welcome to join the holiday fun. The night will include animal organization displays, pet adoption, pet merchandise vendors, and special pet activities.
- 11. *Dec.15<sup>th</sup> Performances* Performers include the Academy of Dance at 5 p.m.; Passage Middle School at 6:10 p.m.; and the City Arts Dance Company at 7:10 p.m.
- 12. Free interactive bracelets The first 3,000 people attending North Pole Nights on Dec. 1, 8 & 15 will receive a

- special L.E.D. wristband, designed to illuminate and change colors in sync with the 5-minute light show at the top of each hour. Pick up your bracelet at the corner of Mariners Row and Fountain Way, starting at 5 p.m.
- 13. *Food and beverage specials* During *North Pole Nights* on Dec. 1, 8 & 15, the patios of many City Center restaurants will become *Jingle and Mingle Lounges*, offering holiday-themed specials to keep you merry and bright! Participating businesses include Aromas, Burger Theory at the Holiday Inn Newport News at City Center, Salsa's Mexican Grill, Kitchen 740 at the Newport News Marriott at City Center, Neo Kitchen + Bar at Cinemark City Center 12, and Tradition Brewing Company.
- 14. *Santa Will Be There!* The former Coldwater Creek at 705 Mariners Row has magically morphed into Santa's Workshop! Bring the kids and a camera, of course to capture that special moment when your children meet with Santa and Mrs. Claus and a few of their hard-working elves! Open 5 to 8 p.m. Dec. 1, 8 & 15 during *North Pole Nights* and from noon to 4 p.m. Dec. 1-2, Dec. 8-9, and Dec. 15-16.
- 15. *Strolling entertainment* Visitors to *North Pole Nights* on Dec. 1, 8 & 15 will be able to interact with a variety of strolling entertainers, like Wacky Chad (a juggler and comedian), Imagine Circus Performers, and a Walking Christmas Tree!

- 20. *Live Nativity Scene* A live nativity will be held from noon to 4 p.m. on Dec. 1, 8 & 15 on the Market Stage, which is between Loft and A Perfect Setting, on Mariners Row.
- 21. *Free Holiday Train Rides for the Kids* A track-less train for children will be set up in the Market Square of City Center from noon to 4 p.m. on Dec. 1-2, Dec. 8-9, and Dec. 15-16.
- 22. *Free Admission and Free Parking* Admission each night is free and free parking is available in the three City Center parking garages, with entrances found on Fountain Way, Merchants Walk, and Canon Boulevard (at Mariners Row).
